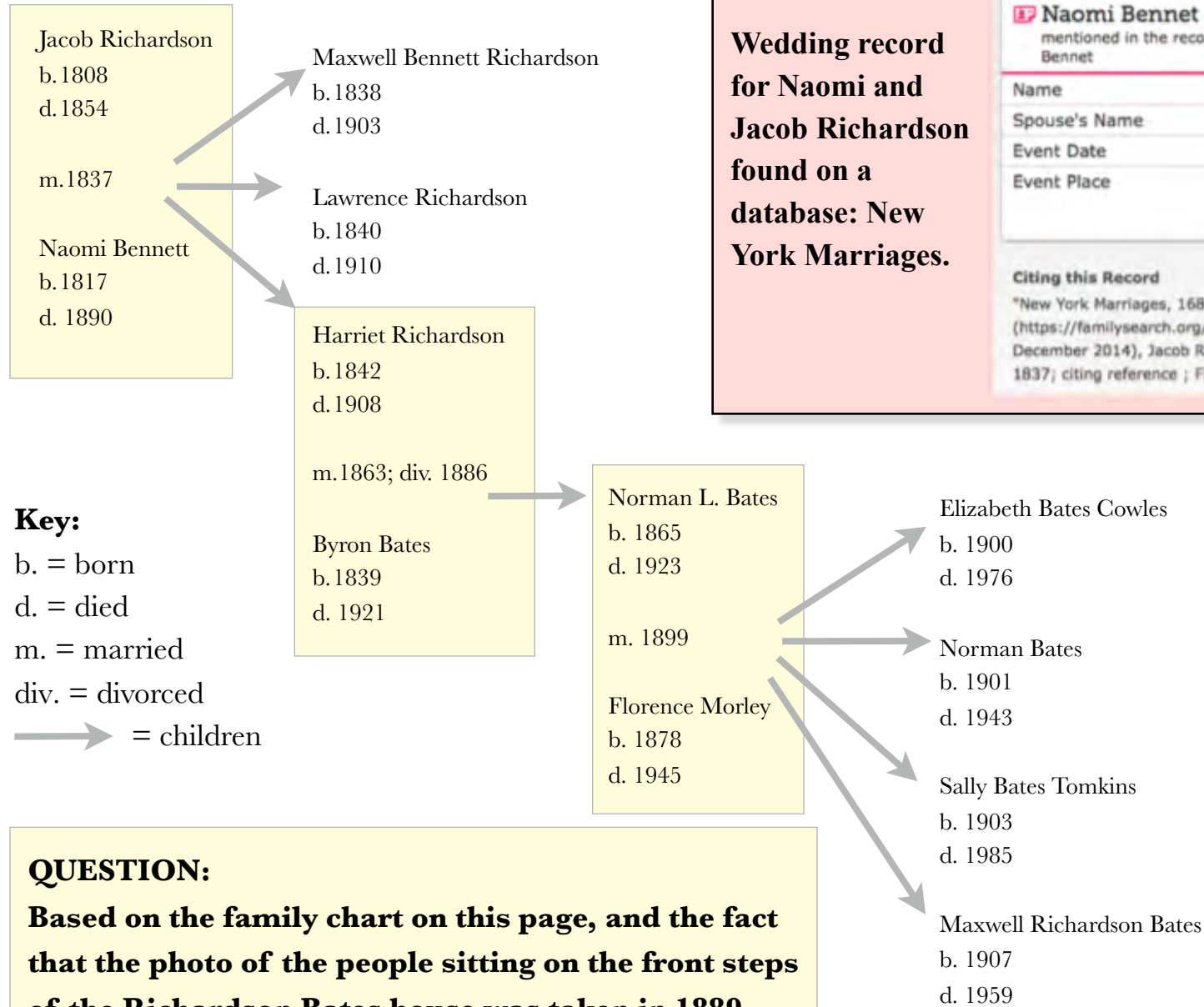

Naomi Richardson's Personal Thoughts

January 1, 1882

I received calls. It was a charming day. We had over 50 callers. Lizzie Bickford was with me. She enjoyed it very much. Mrs. George Grant was to receive me, but Mr. Allen died and was buried that day. Hattie and Normie came home that night. I was very glad to see them. Jan. 1st 1882 (I did not go to church. We had a good dinner. Dr. Coe came. _?_ was _?_.

August 20, 1882 Sunday

A very pleasant day. It is Max birthday. Dr. Coe came to play billiards. Sam and Freddie came in the evening.

August 22, 1882 Tuesday

A pleasant day. I went acalling with Freddie to:

January 10, 1883 Wednesday

A pleasant but cold day. I worked on my silk quilt today. I wrote to Mrs. Eddy. She sent my Toilet set.

January 12, 1883 Friday

Another cold day. I had the headache all day, but I knit on my stocking.

October 19, 1883 Friday

A cloudy day. Mary and Mrs. Champion cleaned the Reception room and Drawing room. Mrs. Parker came to see me. Mrs. Van Auken came. Floy and Joe Grant came. Floy brought the cake. I wrote to Mrs. Cady.

Saturday, December 27, 1884

A pleasant day. I went to Mrs. Gordons to try on my dress, to the bakers for some bread, to Mr. T. Harts got a peck of red apples. Long & Brothers and I got a peck of Hickery nuts, then came home. We had a Christmas box from "Yeah Wagh" he remembered us all. Bell came and got a pattern, Floy Came in the Evening.

March 18, 1889

Foggy today, another girl came to hire out - Max, Norman, and I took Quine(sic) last night.

NOTE:

*Calls, calling, acalling = to go visiting

*Billiards = similar to pool played on a felt covered table

*Quine might mean quinine?

*These are excerpts from Naomi Richardson's diary selected by Dr. Judith Wellman.

*Tillie Grey, great-great granddaughter of Naomi Richardson, owns the diaries from which these excerpts were taken.

*Harriet Richardson married Byron Bates whose sister, Mary Lou Bates, married Dr. Coe.

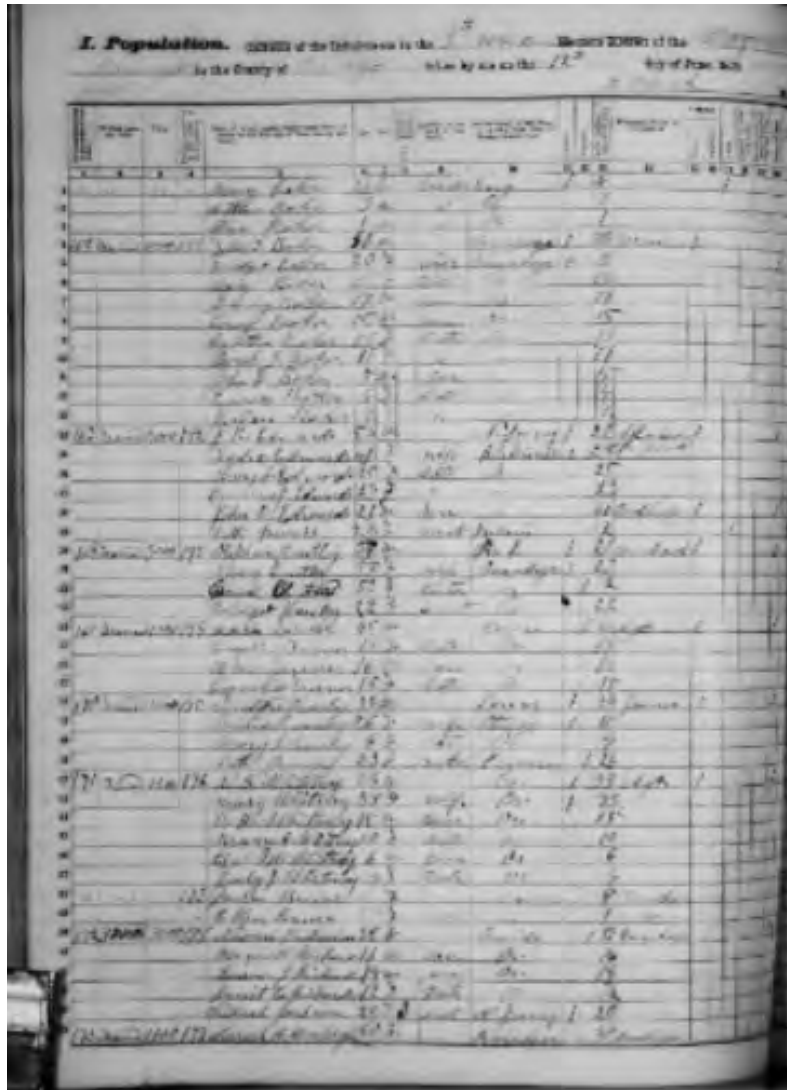

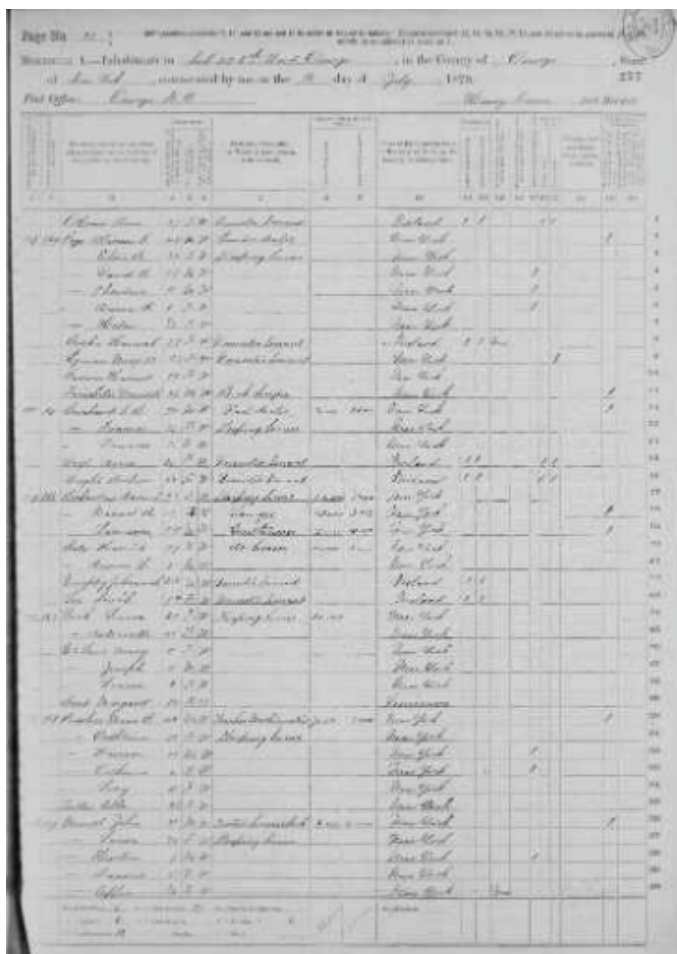
